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Letter from the Director



As we enter a new year, the Regional Planning Commission staff will be embarking on a number of new initiatives and efforts across a number of current programs. In addition to our highway and transit planning programs, we will be continuing our efforts that support the implementation of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA). Working with our stakeholders and partners, RPC has applied for a number of planning grants that we believe will ultimately make this region cleaner, safer, and more economically competitive.

This has been accomplished in no small part by our dedicated staff that has undertaken extensive and targeted outreach to a myriad of stakeholders, local governments, non-profits, advocacy groups, economic

development interests, and the public. That outreach has helped inform our understanding of the needs of both individual communities and, by identifying commonalities, plan for programmatic infrastructure investments and policies.

Consistent with congressional mandates, our aim is to develop specific planning products and outcomes that will lead directly and concisely to implementation. The overarching goal is to bring the policies promulgated in the plans to fruition as actionable projects based on data-driven analysis; the outcomes for which work to enhance the quality of life and economic vitality of our region while being mindful of our responsibilities for social equity and the natural environment.

To that end, RPC continues to monitor funding and partnership opportunities for projects and programs RPC can help implement in our region. RPC staff continues to coordinate with local, state, and federal entities to review opportunities and eligibilities to receive discretionary grant funds for a number of initiatives promulgated in the IIJA.

As always, we look forward to working with our Board members, in appreciation of their leadership, guidance, and service; our partner agencies at the local, state, and federal levels, and the residents of our region who makes us unique in America.

City of Mandeville Bike and Ped Feasibility Study Underway

The Regional Planning Commission, in coordination with the City of Mandeville, is conducting a feasibility study for the purposes of developing a Pedestrian and Bicycle Master Plan for the City of Mandeville. The final product will include recommended actions and strategies for improving mobility for active transportation users within the City of Mandeville, prioritizing safety, connectivity, and implementation feasibility. These recommendations will include both a program of potential infrastructure projects and a collection of model policies and ordinances.

The City of Mandeville last updated their Comprehensive Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan in 2012, and since then, many of the recommendations have been implemented, and traffic conditions and land use conditions have changed. Because of this, the city and the Regional Planning Commission believe an updated plan is necessary to continue improving the transportation network's safety, accessibility, and connectivity. The project goals align closely with the planning priorities outlined in the Regional Planning Commission's Metropolitan Transportation Plan and will assist the city in achieving their desired transportation network. RPC Awarded Additional Funds for Impaired Driving Proven Safety Countermeasure

Building upon past success of the Louisiana Highway Safety Commission (LHSC) funded Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) the RPC received additional funds to continue to expand the program on both the North and South Shore. For fiscal year FFY2023, the RPC plans to hold four SBIRT implementation trainings, two on the north shore, and two on the south shore with the goal of continuing to integrate the program into university, community college, and high school counselling departments. SBIRT is recognized by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration as a proven safety countermeasure to reduce the incidence of impaired driving. will be used to support the
redevelopment of blighted
and neglected properties in

St. Bernard Parish, many of which have yet to recover from Hurricane Katrina's catastrophic flooding in 2005.

RPC recently completed a competitive bid process for environmental services under this grant. We are pleased to announce that Leaaf Environmental, based out of Gretna, Louisiana, will be our prime consultant for this award.

Paratransit Study Wrapping Up

The RPC and Texas Transportation Institute (TTI) are wrapping up a deep dive into our regional paratransit system, with the goal of identifying opportunities to improve service and decrease costs. Paratransit (or "dial-a-ride" services) provide public transportation to those who are elderly, disabled, or otherwise unable to ride traditional transit buses.

TTI has spent the year analyzing our paratransit system and begun to suggest improvements such as how to better allocate dispatcher duties and better align vehicle supply with customer demand throughout the week.

Awards were given for outstanding work in multiple categories. Of note is the Planning Excellence Award for Process given to RPC's New Links Public Transit Operations Analysis and Network Redesign. Sam Buckley, a Senior Transportation Planner at RPC, was the Project Manager for this project and was deservedly recognized at the event. He managed this complex and important effort in collaboration with the Regional Transit Authority, Jefferson Parish Transit, the City of New Orleans, and Ride New Orleans. New Links assessed needs, conducted extensive public outreach, and made recommendations for the future of transit in our region. Many of these recommendations are being implemented today.

Sam was also named the Chapter Volunteer of the Year. As the Metro New Orleans APA President, he was heavily involved in setting up the conference theme (Building our Collective Future/Planning and Public Health), building a strong slate of speakers, and coordinating multiple conference details to benefit all participants.

Congratulations also to St. Bernard Parish for winning the Planning Excellence Award for Plan Implementation. In 2017 RPC assisted the parish in creating the St. Bernard Bikeway and Pedestrian Plan. Thanks to the dedication, perseverance, and leadership in the Parish,

many elements of the plan have come to fruition, including the three-mile Mississippi River Levee Trail between Valero Refinery and Violet, LA, the 40 Arpent Trail between LA 47 and Violet, St. Bernard Highway (LA 46) Bikeway Project, and the St. Bernard Signing and Striping Project including wayfinding signage for bicyclists.
